




Howdy Y'all!

Order forms are in this week's Friday Folder and may be returned with your student on picture day. Additional order forms are in the TCKS office if needed.





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
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Proposed Study Hall Policy Revision Draft

Traut Core Knowledge School Study Hall Policy Approved on February 5, 1998 Revised on [Date]

Study Hall

The purpose of TCKS' study hall is to meet individual student needs by providing a supervised place after school where our students can complete their assignments and get additional help as needed from the study hall tutor/monitor. Our study hall is meant to support the pillar of "Student Responsibility for Learning" in allowing our students to be held accountable for their work while providing a way for them to be successful in completing it. Our study hall also depends on the support provided by the pillar of "Parent Partnership" as it assists and supports parents in their role as their child's "first teacher."

Our student responsibility pillar states that our students are key partners in our goals of educational excellence and fairness, and that they will obtain the desired success as they recognize and accept their responsibility for their own learning. Parents have a primary role in helping students handle increasingly complex tasks as they move through the grades, and they are expected to support student learning by providing a quiet, comfortable study environment in the home and to offer their child assistance as possible. Our study hall is meant to support, and not to supplant, the student, teacher, parent partnerships that makes our school special We emphasize that there is a cost for our students to attend TCKS, and that is the requirement to behave, and to work, both in the classroom during work times as well as at home in completing their homework assignments.

The study hall is for students who are missing assignments and is not to be used as a detention for misbehavior.

The Site Based Management Council may vote to suspend this service temporarily should a financial need arise to do so.



Proposed Charter Revision

This posting is to let our community know of a Charter revision, one which clarifies the Principal Selection Committee process, which has received preliminary approval by our Site Based Management Council. Deletions are in strike-out font, and additions are double-underlined. According to our Charter, final approval of such a revision must take place through a vote of staff and parents (click here to see the Charter on that matter (see section 3)). We have sent out green-colored paper ballots in Friday folders for all parents (one vote for each parent—if you need additional ballots, please contact the office at 488-7500). Eligible staff members have received yellow-colored paper ballots. In order to be counted, ballots must be returned to the school by 4 PM, April 18, 2014. Results of the vote will be posted in the next Friday Notes following the vote. 4.5 Hiring the School Principal

The Poudre School District Board of Education has hiring responsibility for the school principal.

When the need arises to hire a principal, a selection committee will be appointed consisting of two an equal number of non-PAB parents, two non-TAB staff members, two and PAB members, and two TAB members with a minimum of 6 and maximum of 12. The TAB will select the staff members, and the PAB will select the parents to participate on the selection committee. The selection committee shall conduct interviews and select two to four leading candidates by simple majority. Those leading candidates who meet the approval of both the PAB and TAB by majority vote in executive session will become final candidates to be voted on by the selection committee. A 2/3-majority vote of the selection committee will determine the recommendation for principal.

The Poudre School District Board of Education will determine minimum requirements for the position of principal and will have final approval of any candidates who are recommended.
